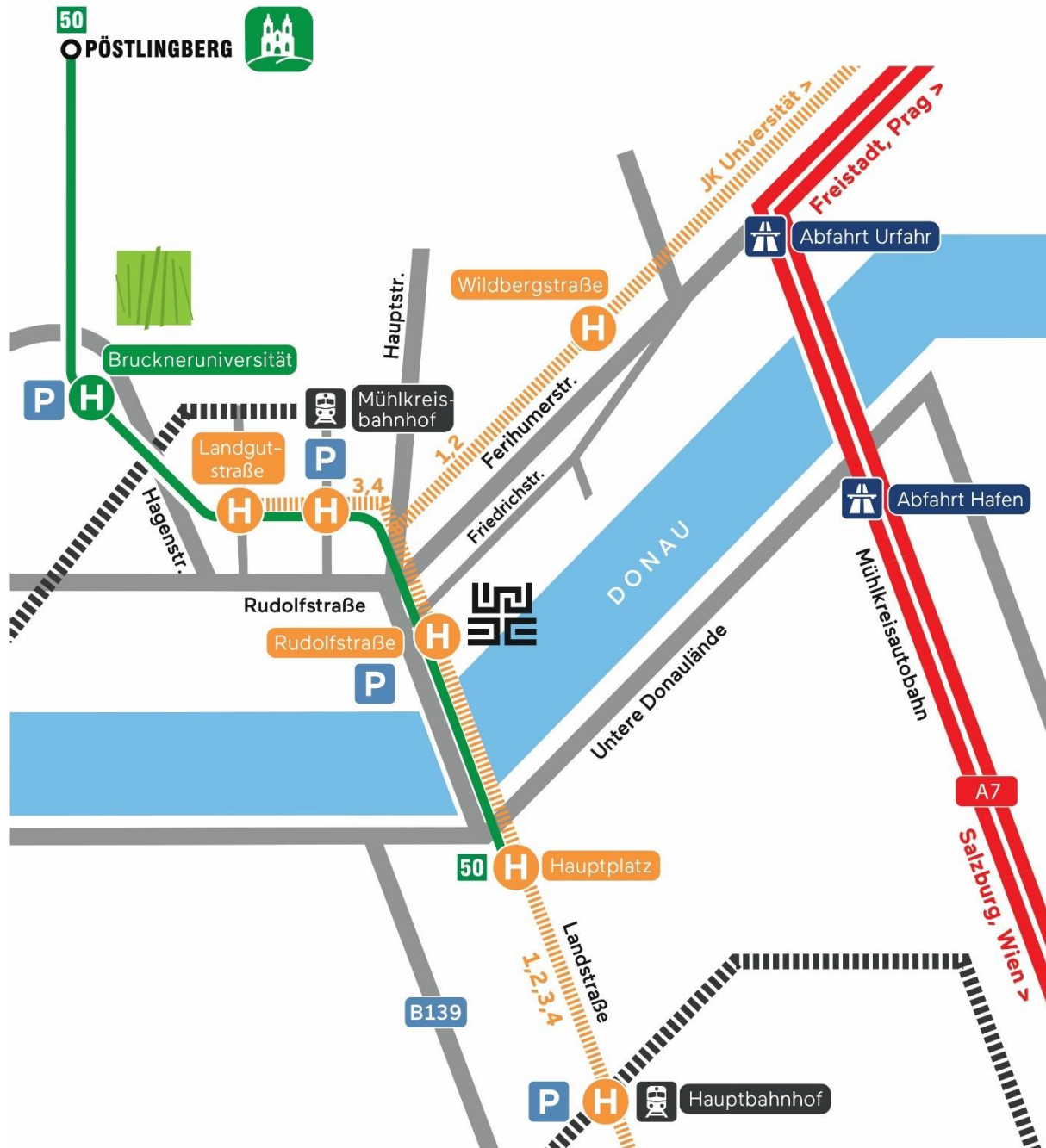

2.3 Entry System

The doors inside of the university building are equipped with an electronic entry system. Your Brucknercard also serves as your access card to the building and the individual rooms of the university.

The access rights for the interior doors must be renewed daily at one of the validation readers. There are 5 card readers in the building:

- Lower Floor, diagonally opposite Lift 2
- Ground Floor, at the Infopoint on both sides
- First & second Floor, directly next to Lift 2
- First Floor, by the administration offices

Access Rights for Students:

- Instruction rooms of the institutes where the enrolled degree programme, the main artistic subject or the minor is completed.
- Additionally, all rooms marked with a green dot on the door sign.

Reduced opening hours apply during vacation periods. To leave the building outside opening hours, please hold your Brucknercard to the terminal in front of the exit doors.

2.6 Lockers

Lockers of varying sizes are available for use on all floors.

Day lockers (marked in green):

Use is free of charge, available daily from 07:00 – 21:30

The lockers are open every morning and are available for use by all students.

2.7 Cloakroom

The cloakroom can be found in the first sub-level of the university.

2.8 Practice Rooms

Students can use several practice rooms at various locations throughout the building. They are readily accessible and do not need to be reserved before use. They can be opened using your Brucknercard.

We ask you to leave the practice rooms in a clean and orderly state. Eating and drinking in the rooms is **forbidden**. Practice rooms where no person is present are considered free, even if there is an instrument, jacket, etc. in the room.

2.9 WIFI/eduroam

The ABU is one of the organisations participating in „eduroam” (Education Roaming). Eduroam is an initiative which enables students and employees to use the wireless network infrastructure of many educational institutions at home and abroad by means of the access data of their home university or college.

Once the connection has been successfully established the set-up is complete, and you can use eduroam with all other participating organisations as well.



Practical tip: To ensure that your device reliably connects to eduroam, remove the WIFI for guests from the list of known networks if you have already connected to it before.

2.10 Bistro Frédéric

The Bistro Frédéric, the small but exceptional restaurant located in the foyer, is a place where teachers, students and guests can meet during the day to enjoy a quick snack or a warm meal. Every day two warm meals are offered for lunch, as well as sandwiches, snacks, fruit and desserts.

Opening Hours during the semester: Mo – Thu 08:00 – 18:00, Fr 08:00 – 17:00.

Closed during the vacation period.

2.11 Fenzl Bakery Bus

In front of the university, a snack bus of the bakery Fenzl stops from Monday to Thursday during the week and offers warm and cold snacks, bakery products as well as drinks.

Generally, the bus stops in front of the main entrance of the ABU between 10:50 and 11:05.

2.12 Public Transportation & Accessibility

The ABU can be reached using public transportation, either with the **Pöstlingbergbahn / Pöstlingberg Railway (No. 50), the bus no. 33 and 150, the ÖBB Postbus No. 250 or No. 251 or the tram lines 3 and 4** (tram station “Landgutstraße” – 12 minutes’ walk). It is a 20 minutes’ walk from Hauptplatz. An electronic monitor in the foyer displays upcoming departure times.

2.13 Parking Garage

Limited parking is available in the in-house parking garage.

Reference time: Free exit within 1 hour.

Parking tariff: € 1,25 / 30min

Cultural tariff 18:00 - 22:00: € 0.75 / 30min

Maximum daily rate: € 14.00

Please note: Payment is only possible with debit/credit card at the ticket machine or at the exit terminal, no cash payment. Payment is also possible via online monthly invoice by registering with JJJames at <https://portal.jjames.eu/register>.

The parking garage offers two e-charging stations with 11 KW each, plug type 2. Direct payment with credit card or with a Linz AG charging card (40% discount).

3 Initial Enrolment / Re-Registration

Dates and Deadlines: Students are responsible for fulfilling their own deadlines. Therefore, it is recommended that dates and deadlines are regularly reviewed and scheduled. Please refer to our website:

For **first-time enrolment**, the signed admission contract and the tuition fee must be received by September 1 for the winter semester. You **must appear in person at the Student Service Office** during the admission period (see next page).

As a first semester-student, you will get from the Student Service:

- **Admission contract:** will be sent by email with the enrolment documents
- **Access data/TAN code for bruckneronline + webmail:** Valid for 150 days! Redeem TAN code: see accompanying letter TAN code or in this guide under 6.1. If you lose your TAN code, please request a new one from Student Service
- **Brucknercard:** student identity card (photo will be taken directly in the Student Service Office)

Enrolment in the following semesters (re-registration) takes place after receipt of your full tuition fee including the ÖH fee.

Important: Enrolment is only possible during the **admission period (10 September to 05 October and 10 February to 05 March)** or the **late enrolment period/grace period (06 October to 31 October and 06 March to 31 March)**.

A grace period fee of 100 Euros will be charged during the grace period.

No enrolments will be done after the end of the late enrolment period!

- Core subject (MAJ) must be graded positively in bruckneronline
- Tuition fee including the ÖH fee must be received by university → see email with payment information during semester and summer breaks
- Study entry phase (STEOP) must be completed within the first two semesters

After Enrolment / Receipt of Enrolment Confirmation email:

- Confirmation of enrolment: can be printed online through bruckneronline (Enrolment Documents)
- **Course Registration:** during the registration period by student using bruckneronline, **except for core subject (MAJ)** and the **first semester of your minor subject (MIN)**, which are carried out **by the Student Service**.

The regular **registration deadlines for courses** are
in the winter semester: 10 September to 05 October
in the summer semester: 10 February to 05 March

- If you are permitted to attend a course after the registration deadline, the respective lecturer must register you for it in bonline.
- You must be registered in the course so that the relevant course can be graded at the end of the semester!



Practical tip: Register for courses early.
For many there is a limited number of participants!

An **additional administrative fee of € 100,-** is to be paid for late enrolment (please refer to “Dates and Deadlines” on our website). This also applies to applications submitted during the late enrolment period (grace period). For details see: <https://www.bruckneruni.ac.at/en/academics/information/enrolment>



Practical tip: Avoid paying the late enrolment fee of € 100,- by paying your tuition fee on time! In addition, you must already be enrolled in order to register for courses.

4 Recognition and Crediting

Students of the ABU can have passed examinations and existing knowledge recognized/credited. The recognition/credit is based on a comparison of competencies.

The prerequisite for the recognition of courses is the equivalence of the content and scope of the respective examinations. Activities at institutions other than universities can be credited upon application by students, depending on the type and scope of the activity.

5 Brucknercard

The valid Brucknercard includes the following functions:

- classic student identity card
- card for copying, printing and scanning. The machine on the ground floor can be used to load money onto the card which can then be used for printing
- library card
- access card for classrooms and practice rooms; right of access must be obtained daily at a validation station

The Brucknercard will be issued to you in the Student Service Office on your initial enrolment. There is no initial charge, and you will also receive a credit of € 5,- for printing and copying.

In subsequent semesters, you will update the date imprint yourself at the identity card renewal machine (on the ground floor between Infopoint and Sonic Lab) after you have re-registered and received automatic notification of enrolment.

A charge of € 7,- will be made for a replacement card in the event of loss, theft or damage, to be paid in the finance department (Room 1.121, 1st Floor). Show the receipt for this charge in the Student Service Office, where a new Brucknercard will be printed for you.

6 bruckneronline (bonline)

bruckneronline is the central information system for students and teachers of the ABU. Many do-it-yourself options are available. As it is a web-based system, only a web browser and internet access is required. Don't forget to deactivate the pop-up blocker for bonline.bruckneruni.at/!

Using bruckneronline, you can access all important information concerning your studies and courses, such as:

- Enrolment status, tuition payment status
- Course registration
- Exam results
- Print student files such as Confirmation of Registration
- Change your current/home address information
- Recognitions

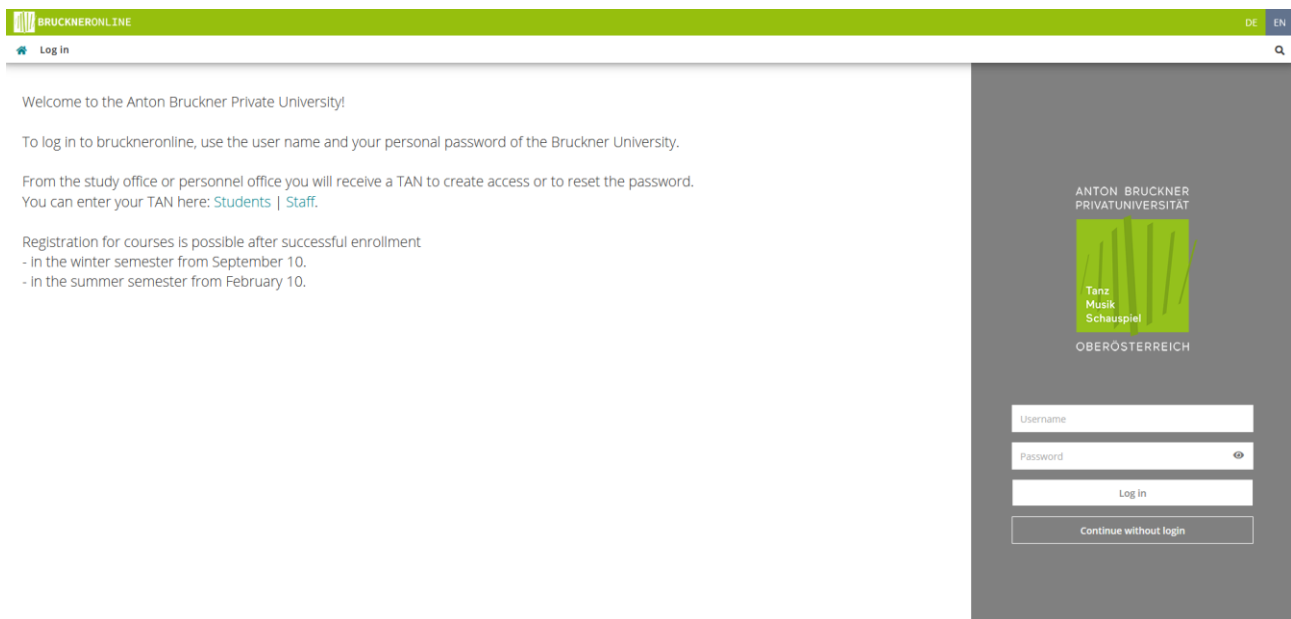

6.1 Login to bruckneronline

Redeem the TAN-code to receive your login details:

- Start web browser and open <https://bonline.bruckneruni.at/>
- Follow the link "You can enter your TAN here" (the link is highlighted in blue in the text)

- Enter the above TAN, matriculation number and your date of birth
- Make a note of the user name (looks like this: s12345) and choose a password
- This will create your account at the ABU. The account is necessary for bonline, webmail, access to the university building, Eduroam, Moodle, etc.

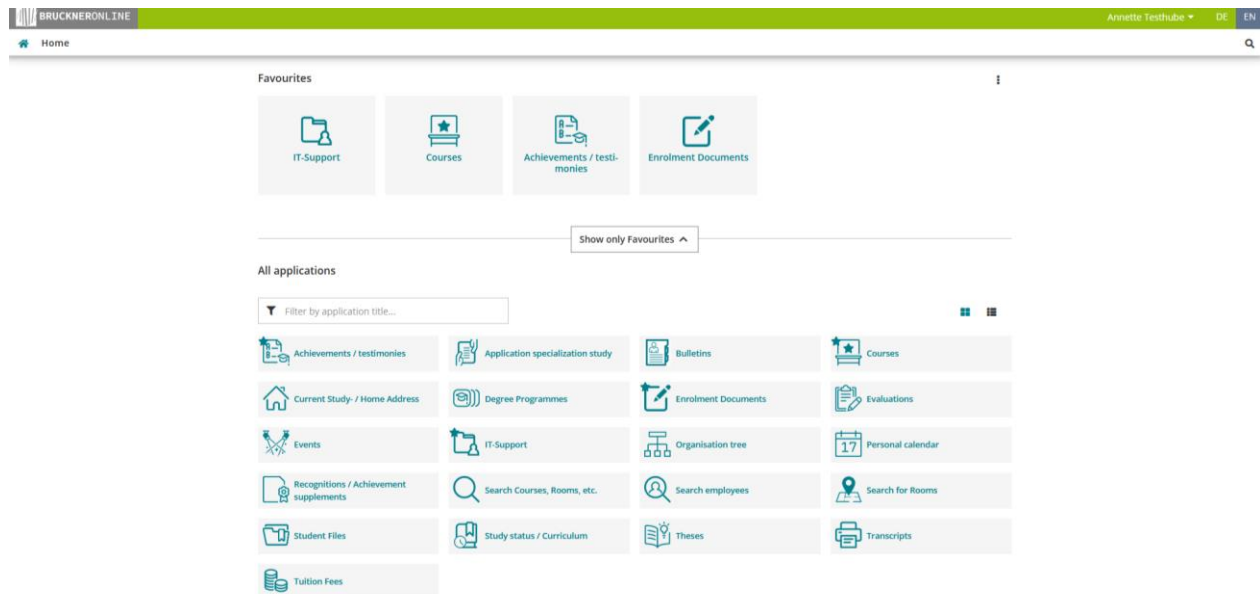

Practical tip: we only send official messages to the ABU email-address, not your private email-address! Therefore, please check your ABU-mailbox regularly.

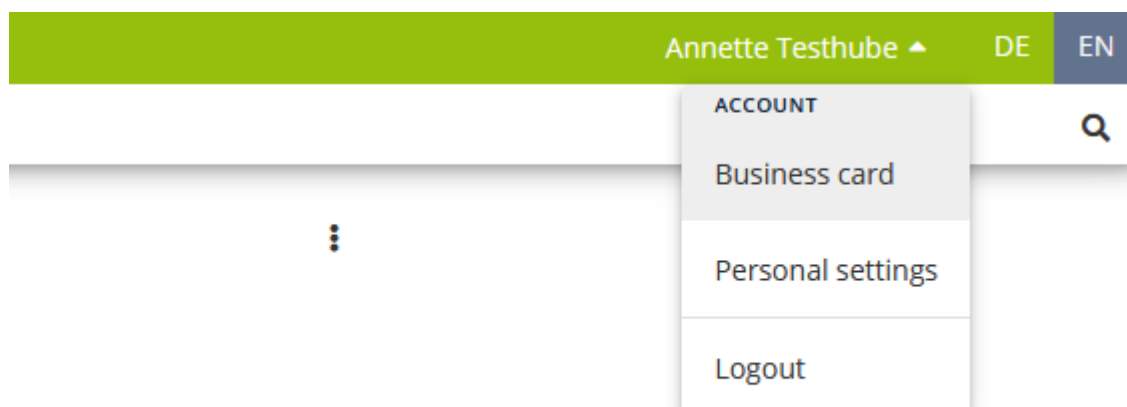
6.2 Applications in bonline

6.4.2 How can I register for courses?

You can register for courses in the **"Courses" application**.

Under **"All courses"**, search for the course by title according to the curriculum. Click on the button **"View course registration details"** (only appears in the period for which registration is generally possible). Click on the **"Register"** button.

Under **"MyCourses"** you can see which courses you are registered for.

It is only possible to register for a course if you are enrolled for at least one study program (check status on Business Card) and this course has not yet been attended and graded (existing grade).

- In the case of a double degree it is required to choose through which degree program you would like to register for the course.
- **When registering, please pay attention to the type of degree listed:**
BA = Bachelor, **MA** = Master, **KBA** = artistic Bachelor, **PBA** = pedagogical Bachelor, **KMA** = artistic Master, **PMA** = pedagogical Master, **ABF** = Pre-College, **Gast** = extramural studies

The following **abbreviations** are used for the main and core subjects:

MAJ = central artistic subject

MME = artistic main subject (only teacher training program)

MIN = artistic minor subject (focus)

The Studo app helps students organize their studies by providing access to various university applications from a central location. The app offers an overview of courses attended, including grades, a calendar that is automatically filled with the timetable, and chats where students can engage with each other. In addition, Studo makes it easy to stay up to date: Not only can university emails be accessed in the app, but there is also a dedicated news feed reserved for the most important news for everyday university life. Students at ABU automatically receive the pro version of the Studo app free of charge.

The postings via the Studo app are in German language only.



8 University Library

With over 100.000 media, the University Library is the largest music library in Upper Austria and supports study, research and teaching at the university. In addition to physical media such as music publications, books, journals, and AV media, a variety of e-resources such as e-journals, e-books, sheet music download portals, or streaming offerings are available. All digital resources can also be used outside the library by means of bruckneronline login data. The entire collection is listed in the library catalog, AnTon:search.

9 Symphony Orchestra of the Anton Bruckner University (ABU)

Orchestral playing is an essential part of the curriculum at the Anton Bruckner University. The **Symphony Orchestra of the Anton Bruckner University** brings together students from different countries in Europe and around the world who, during their studies at ABU, work with internationally renowned conductors at least once per semester in intensive rehearsal phases to prepare and perform the great and significant orchestral works of music history. The repertoire ranges from early music to classical and romantic literature to contemporary music.

Highlights of the previous academic year 2024/2025 included performances at WIEN MODERN, Austria's largest and most important festival for contemporary music, where the orchestra performed together with the MUK.symphon orchestra in the ballroom of the famous Vienna City Hall, a Christmas concert in Linz Cathedral, and a magnificent orchestra concert featuring works by Debussy, Ravel and Bartók in the Brucknerhaus Linz.

10 Erasmus+

Erasmus+ is the European Union's program for education, youth and sport and offers a wide range of opportunities for students to study at universities abroad, further their education, gain valuable work experience through internships and build international networks.

Advantages at a glance:

- Credit transfer of study achievements
- Validation of prior learning (Diploma Supplement)
- Waiver of regular tuition fees (per mobility semester, only the ÖH fee at the ABU and a possible administration fee at the host institution have to be paid)
- New acquisition and improvement of language skills
- Cultivate intercultural skills
- Establish international networks
- and so much more... **the experience of a lifetime awaits!**

Regular students of ABU can become mobile from the 3rd semester. For each cycle of study (BA, MA) one Erasmus+ mobility grant of a duration of up to twelve months can be provided. The funding amount depends on the destination country and is not a full scholarship, but a grant to compensate for the increased costs due to the stay abroad.

The following options are available:

- **Study abroad mobility:** You want to enrich your university education with international competence and valuable cross-sectional competencies? Then study for a semester or an entire academic year at a partner institution abroad. Upon successful completion you receive a validation of prior learning at ABU.

- **Internship Mobility:** You independently organize an internship at a relevant institution (which is not an EU institution or diplomatic representation) in a program country that is neither Austria nor your country of residence, where you work full-time for at least two months? Then you have two options to apply for funding; either for a voluntary internship, during your current studies, or a graduate internship, which you complete within the first year after your degree completion.

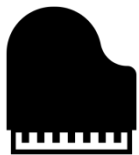
